As you know, Gary Scott has been pursuing a permit from MoDOT for a break in limited access, more commonly called a right-in/right-out, along the MO Rte. 7 side of Scott Development. The RI/RO will connect to a platted and recorded right-of-way, which will eventually become a city street, contingent upon being constructed to city specs.

## MISSOURI HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION BREAK IN LIMITED ACCESS AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission (hereinafter, "Commission"), whose address is P.O. Box 270, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102, and the City of Clinton (hereinafter, "City"), whose address is 105 East Ohio Street, Clinton Missouri 64735.

## WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the City claims to own and have exclusive right to possession, use, and control of certain real estate in Northwest Quarter (NW 1/4) of the Southwest Quarter (SW 1/4) of Section 35, Township 42 North, Range 26 West, in Henry County; and

WHEREAS, by a condemnation recorded in case number 8063 in the Office of the Henry County Circuit court, all right of access between said state highway and the City's abutting land in Northwest Quarter (NW ½) of the Southwest Quarter (SW ½) of Section 35, Township 42 North, Range 26 West was restricted to a certain location (or locations) therein set out; and

WHEREAS, the City now requests and the Commission is willing to allow the City access to Route 7 as hereinafter set out.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the payment of one dollars (\$1) made payable to the Director of Revenue-Credit State Road Fund by the City to the Commission, and the promises, covenants, and representations contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- (1) <u>BREAK IN ACCESS</u>: It is agreed and the Commission hereby grants to the City, its successors and assigns, the right of access to Route 7 from Station 48+23.89 to Station 48+59.89 on the existing southernly right of way line.
- (2) GEOMETRIC IMPROVEMENTS: The City shall construct or cause to be constructed geometric improvements along Route 7. The improvements shall include but are not limited to, widening Route 7 along to provide for a right turn lane and median for right in right out access. The construction of geometric improvements shall be in accordance with plans submitted to the Commission's District Engineer. The City shall submit plans to the Commission's District Engineer prior to any permits being issued.
- (3) <u>COSTS</u>: All costs associated with the construction of the proposed geometric improvements shall be borne entirely by the City, with no cost incurred by the Commission.

- (4) <u>PLANS</u>: The City shall have detailed plans prepared at their cost, which are to be submitted to the Commission's District Engineer for the Commission's review and approval.
- (5) <u>RELOCATION</u>: The City shall secure the removal, relocation or adjustment of any public or private utilities located on private easements or public right-of way, if the construction of the herein contemplated geometric improvements so required, without cost to the Commission.
- (6) <u>INSPECTION</u>: The City will allow inspection of the construction of the herein contemplated geometric improvements by the Commission's District Engineer, or his authorized representative, at any time and shall take no attempts to prevent said inspection. Within (30) days following notice by the City to the Commission that construction is complete, the Commission will inspect the work to determine that it is acceptable.
- (7) <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>: The City shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Commission, including its members and department employees, from any claim or liability whether based on a claim for damages to real or personal property or to a person for any matter relating to or arising out of the City's performance of its obligations under this Agreement.
- (8) <u>COMMISSION RIGHT OF WAY</u>: All improvements made within the state-owned right-of-way shall become the Commission's property, and all future alterations, modifications, or maintenance thereof, will be the responsibility of the Commission.
- (9) <u>PERMITS</u>: Before beginning work, the City shall secure from the Commission's District Engineer a permit for the proposed improvement. Issuance of the permit is within the sole discretion of the Commission's district engineer.
- (10) <u>BOND</u>: The City shall secure sufficient bond, as determined by the Commission's District Engineer or its authorized representative, for the construction of the proposed improvement on Commission right-of-way.
- (11) <u>CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS</u>: All construction of the proposed geometric improvements shall be according to the latest editions of the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission's *Standard Specifications for Highway Construction*, Standard Plans for Highway Construction, and the Missouri Department of Transportation's *Approved Products List for Traffic Signals and Highway Lighting*.
- (12) <u>AMENDMENTS</u>: Any change in this Agreement, whether by modification or supplementation, must be accomplished by a formal contract amendment signed and approved by the duly authorized representative of the City and the Commission.
- (13) <u>ASSIGNMENT</u>: The City shall not assign, transfer or delegate any interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the Commission.

- (14) <u>AUDIT OF RECORDS</u>: The City must maintain all records relating to this Agreement, including but not limited to invoices, payrolls, etc. These records must be available at all reasonable times at no charge to the Commission and/or its designees or representatives during the period of this Agreement and any extension thereof, and for three (3) years from the date of final payment made under this Agreement.
- (15) <u>CANCELLATION</u>: The Commission may cancel this Agreement at any time for a material breach of contractual obligations or for convenience by providing the City with written notice of cancellation. Should the Commission exercise its right to cancel the contract for such reasons, cancellation will become effective upon the date specified in the notice of cancellation sent to the City.
- (16) <u>LAW OF MISSOURI TO GOVERN</u>: This Agreement shall be construed according to the laws of the state of Missouri. The City shall comply with all local, state and federal laws and regulations relating to the performance of this Agreement.
- (17) <u>VENUE</u>: It is agreed by the parties that any action at law, suit in equity, or other judicial proceeding to enforce or construe this Agreement, or regarding its alleged breach, shall be instituted only in the Circuit Court of Cole County, Missouri.
- (18) <u>SECTION HEADINGS</u>: All section headings contained in this Agreement are for the convenience of reference only and are not intended to define or limit the scope of any provision of this Agreement.
- (19) <u>SOLE BENEFICIARY</u>: This Agreement is made for the sole benefit of the parties hereto and nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to give any rights or benefits to anyone other than the Commission and the City.
- (20) <u>AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE</u>: The signers of this Agreement warrant that they are acting officially and properly on behalf of their respective institutions and have been duly authorized, directed and empowered to execute this Agreement.
- (21) <u>ENTIRE AGREEMENT</u>: This Agreement represents the entire understanding between the parties regarding this subject and supersedes all prior written or oral communications between the parties regarding this subject.
- (22) <u>SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS</u>: The provisions of this Agreement shall apply to and be binding upon the parties executing this Agreement, their successors, assigns, agents, subsidiaries, affiliates, and lessees, including officers, employees, agents, servants, corporations, and any persons acting under, through, or for the parties agreeing hereto.
- (23) TERMINATION AND REVERSION: All geometric improvements required to be constructed pursuant to this Agreement must be completed within nine (9) months of issuing the permit. If the City fails to construct the geometric improvements within the time allowed, the Commission may terminate this Agreement and the break in access granted pursuant to this Agreement will be voidable at the Commission's option. If the Commission determines to terminate the Agreement, the Commission will provide

written notice of the termination to the City. If the Commission terminates this Agreement, the break in access granted pursuant to this Agreement shall lapse and the entrance shall immediately revert to the Commission. Further, the reversion will be without any compensation or damages paid to the City for the loss of the break in access. Upon reversion, the Commission may obstruct or otherwise eliminate the access.

Dear Ms. Maggi,

Please accept this letter on behalf of the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission (MHTC) as a Letter of Understanding concerning the Break in Limited Access Agreement (Agreement) for the connection of Scott Road to Route 7 and Route 13 Business Loop.

Route 7 and a portion of Route 13 Business Loop is owned and maintained by MHTC as a limited access highway. The break in access for Scott Road was approved by MHTC based on its classification as a public road that will become a city street under the control of the City of Clinton.

- MHTC and City of Clinton understands that the City does not 'own' the real estate adjacent to
  where the break-in-limited-access will be located. The City does not have title to the real
  estate. It is a dedicated public right-of-way, per an approved and recorded plat.
- 2. MHTC and City of Clinton understands regarding Item 2 through Item 9 of the Agreement that the initial construction of Scott Road will be performed by a private contractor and paid for by a private developer. The private developer will be responsible for the design, construction and all costs associated with the project. The street will be constructed to City specs, and upon completion the street will be accepted by the City as a public street.
- 3. MHTC and City of Clinton understands that regarding 'Item #9 Permits' of the Agreement that the permit issued by MHTC will not have any associated fees to the City of Clinton.
- 4. MHTC and City of Clinton understands that regarding 'Item #13 Assignment' of the Agreement that the break in access itself cannot be assigned to another party without the written consent of MHTC. However, MHTC will and does consent for the City to enter into an agreement with the developer who will construct the break-in-access.
- MHTC and City of Clinton understands that upon completion and acceptance of Scott Road by the City of Clinton, the City of Clinton will be responsible for the continued maintenance of the road improvements made under the permit issued by MHTC for this project.



We are hopeful that this letter of understanding will satisfy the City's concerns with some of the language within the Agreement. As mentioned in our phone call today, MHTC is prepared to issue a permit for the construction of the project upon the signing of the Agreement by the City of Clinton and the determination of the contractor by the developer. MHTC will still need to complete our portion of signing the Agreement and will get this done promptly after receiving 2 original copies of the signed agreement and the approved ordinance from the City.

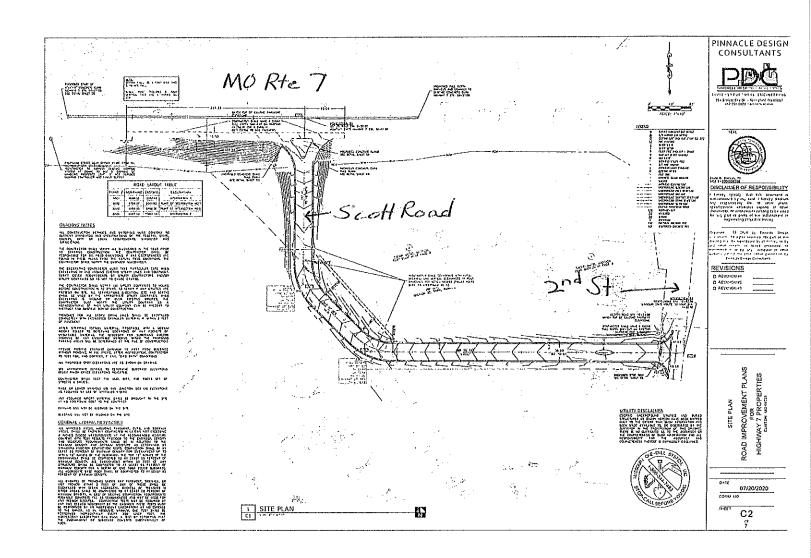

**MEMO** 

RE: Shipping Containers

I spoke with the Doug Harris concerning the use of shipping containers as storage buildings. He stated that we can address shipping containers through a zoning amendment, or through a general health and safety ordinance that restricts their use outright as a blight/nuisance. However we choose to address these containers, we need to be sure not to do anything that would regulate their actual use in shipping or interstate commerce. That would be a constitutional violation. There are, of course, a variety of ways to address them in the zoning realm, to include time limitations, what zones they are allowed within, what type of use they are suitable for (storage but not as a residence), and perhaps also conditional use permit regulations. Doug suggests taking a look at some examples from other communities and putting together some of those options for the Council to consider. He has used the general prohibition approach in smaller communities that do not have a zoning code, and he can give us an example to look at if Clinton decides to move that direction. He added that is the most aggressive approach, and probably the most likely to face legal challenge. Zoning rules are the easiest defensible route.

I would propose defining the term "shipping container" in our zoning code, then amending our zoning code to allow shipping containers as an accessory use in the C-3 General Commercial district. This, in turn, would allow for their use in the C-4, I-1, I-2, and I-3 zoning districts.

A REVISED AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF CLINTON, MISSOURI (CITY), AND THE GREATER CLINTON AREA CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, INC. (CHAMBER) FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT SERVICES.

WHEREAS, the City of Clinton desires to improve the economic climate in Clinton through the growth and development of existing businesses and the attraction and development of new businesses; and

WHEREAS, the Greater Clinton Area Chamber of Commerce, Inc. has the desire and expertise to provide the services to improve the economic climate in Clinton through the growth and development of existing businesses and the attraction and development of new businesses; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Chamber entered in an agreement on March 17, 2015, for economic development services; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Chamber mutually consent to revise the March 17, 2015 agreement;

## NOW, THEREFORE THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Chamber shall;
  - a. Provide business retention services to all businesses within Clinton requesting said services;
  - b. Promote available buildings and property at Gerhart Industrial Park
  - c. Promote Clinton to new and relocating businesses;
  - d. Respond to all inquiries from potential new and relocating businesses;
  - e. Maintain positive relationships with the Missouri Department of Economic Development, the Missouri Economic Development Council, the Missouri Partnership, and other economic development organizations, as needed;
  - f. Maintain membership in the Central Missouri Economic Development Alliance (CMEDA);
  - g. Promote the Henry County Clinton Enhanced Enterprise Zone; and
  - h. Engage in other activities, as needed, in order to provide the above mentioned services.
  - Accept the appointment of one City Council member to serve as a voting member of the Chamber Board of Directors. Said Council member will be appointed by the Mayor and approved by the City Council.
  - j. Employ an Economic Development Director who is certified or progressing toward certification.
  - j. Comply with the State of Missouri's laws requiring:
    - a signed affidavit certifying compliance with the certification of the legal employment status of all workers employed by the Chamber; and
    - 2. required documentary proof of lawful presence.

- 2. In consideration of the Chamber providing the above services, the City shall pay to the Chamber the sum of \$96,000 for the term of this agreement. Said payment shall be made in installments of \$24,000 on January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1. In the event the Chamber does not comply with Section 1.j., installment payments shall be in the amount of \$5,000, on the dates previously identified, until such time when the Chamber is again in compliance with Section 1.j.
- 3. The City shall also waive building, table and chair rent for 11 days at the Benson Convention Center. The Chamber shall provide volunteer labor for set-up and break-down of each event on these days. A good-faith effort shall be made by both parties to coordinate schedules for the 11 days.
- 4. The Chamber shall provide the City a copy of its annual budget and a copy of its annual financial statement.
- 5. The Economic Development Director shall present regular reports to the City Council on a monthly basis through the Project Activity Tracker;
- 6. The term of this agreement shall be effective upon execution by both parties.

WHEREAS, the Clinton Tourism Association is the official Destination Marketing Organization (DMO) for the City of Clinton;

## NOW, THEREFORE THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1.) The City of Clinton, Missouri shall pay to the Clinton Tourism Association all revenue received from the tourism tax, less two percent (2%) of the total received, which shall be retained by the City of Clinton, Missouri for administrative expenses. Said payments to the Clinton Tourism Association shall be made monthly by the first day of the following month.
- 2.) Each year the Clinton Tourism Association shall provide the Clinton Tourism Commission a copy of the Clinton Tourism Association's approved annual budget, where upon the Clinton Tourism Commission shall present the budget to the Clinton City Council. The City Clerk of the Lessee and any other officer of Lessee who shall have power to do so be, and each of them hereby is, authorized to affix the official seal of Lessee to the Agreement and attest the same.

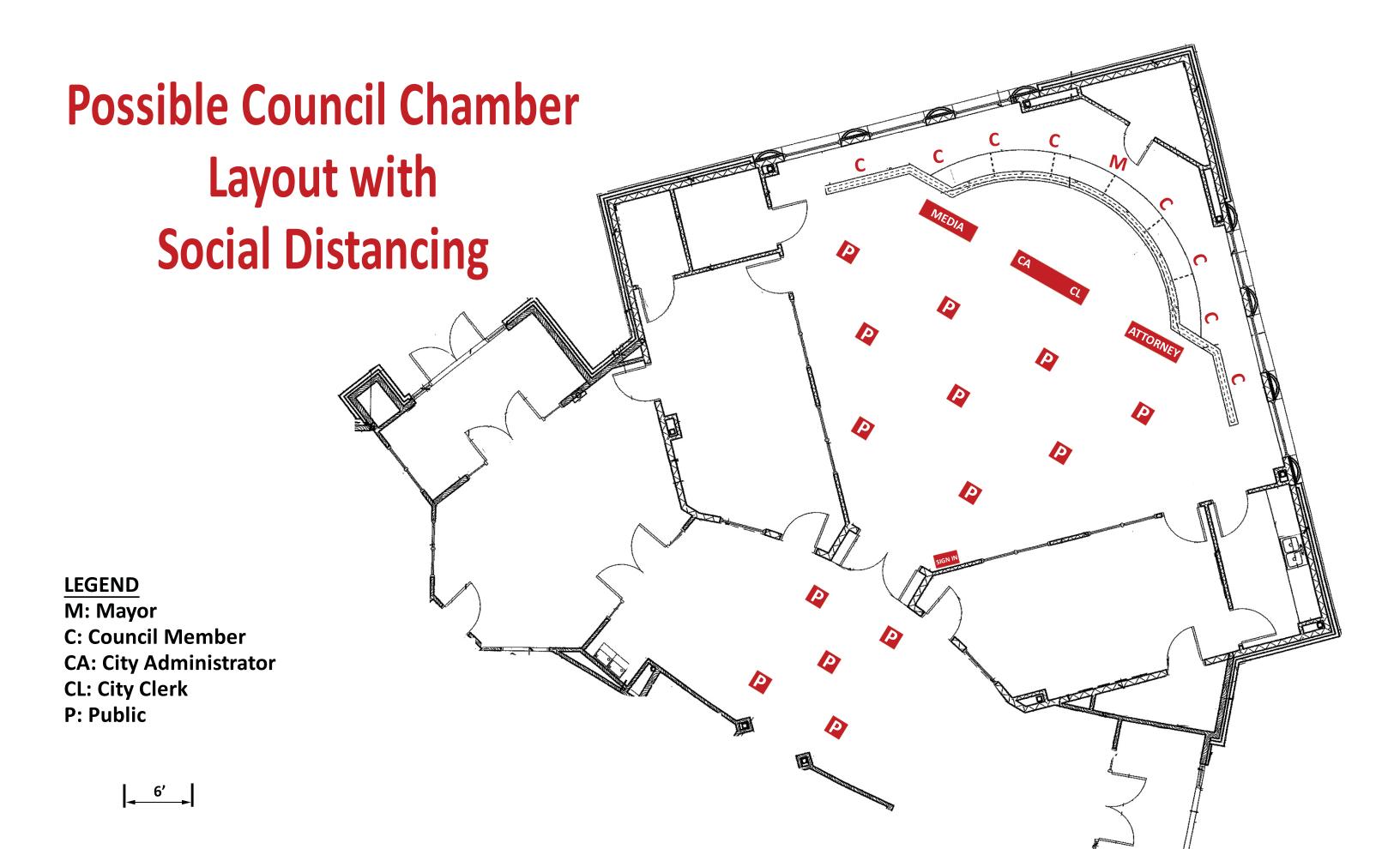
