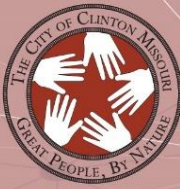

The City Council of the City of Clinton, Missouri met via Zoom Video Conference with Live Stream on YouTube on Tuesday, November 17, 2020. Mayor Greg Lowe presided.

a. **Community COVID-19 Update:** Craig Thompson, CEO of Golden Valley Memorial Hospital, spoke about the current conditions at GVMH. Currently about 40 staff members are on quarantine and 15 COVID patients are at the hospital. The availability of staffed beds has been reduced in Clinton and surrounding areas due to staff on isolation. GVMH has had to send patients as far as St. Louis and Arkansas due to Kansas City hospitals being closed to new patients last week. Patients with other medical emergencies other than COVID are also needing beds, which is a large concern at the moment. Curbside testing is available daily at the previous Saint Luke's building and at Compass Health. COVID hospitalization rates have also gone up. Mr. Thompson requests that the City Council pass an ordinance requiring masks and limiting the size of gatherings.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CLINTON REGARDING AN AMENDMENT TO A GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF CLINTON (CITY) AND THE MISSOURI HIGHWAY AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION (COMMISSION) PROVIDING FOR CONSULTANT PLANNING SERVICES.

WHEREAS, the City and Commission entered into an Agreement for Project No. 16-022A-1, executed by the City on February 21, 2017 and executed by the Commission on February 27, 2017 for grant funds in the amount not to exceed \$127,354 for the Master Plan and ALP Update, Environmental Work, and AGIS for Runway 4/22 Development; and

WHEREAS, the City and Commission entered into Amendment #1 to the Original Agreement, executed by the City on November 20, 2018, and executed by the Commission on December 6, 2018, to extend the project time to allow for completion; and

WHEREAS, the parties now wish to again extend the project time to allow for completion of the work;

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF CLINTON, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, Diane and Ed Hannah have filed an application to re-zone the property commonly known as 301 E. Ohio from R-1 Residential to R-2 Residential; and

WHEREAS, Lora Anstine has filed an application to re-zone the property commonly known as 415 W. Rogers from R-4 Residential – High Density Multi-Family to C-O Commercial - Office; and

WHEREAS, the Clinton Planning Commission conducted a public hearing on November 2, 2020, in consideration of the application; and

WHEREAS, the Clinton Planning Commission recommended approval of the application by a vote of 5 Ayes, 0 Nays, 2 Absent; and

WHEREAS, the property to be re-zoned is legally described as follows:

In order to provide our insureds better service and administrative efficiency, Travelers Public Sector Services is pleased to provide the following process for handling mid-term automobile change requests. All requests will be managed in accordance with the Composite Rate Application outlined below. The insured should continue to submit all change requests to their agent for accurate record keeping and claims verification purposes. Particular attention should be paid to Item 5, which specifies the types of automobiles that will continue to require reporting to the Company.

Composite Rate Application

1. If your policy includes the coverage for which a composite rate is designated in the table below then the premium for that coverage is composite rated. Automobile Liability is rated on a "per unit" basis and Automobile Physical Damage is rated on the basis of the original cost new of the autos. **The composite rates reflect premium charges for any applicable miscellaneous auto coverages, with the exception of Garagekeepers Legal Liability.**
2. The composite rates for Automobile Liability and Physical Damage are the rates applicable at the inception of the policy. Based on the information provided for this proposal and as of the date of this proposal, these rates are as follows:

4. All autos added will carry the same Liability limits and Physical Damage deductibles issued at policy inception for autos of the same type.
5. Any new auto requiring valuation other than actual cash value must be reported within 30 days of acquisition. These autos will be added to the policy automobile schedule mid-term and a final premium will be determined at policy expiration.

Federal Terrorism Risk Insurance Act Disclosure

The federal Terrorism Risk Insurance Act of 2002 as amended ("TRIA") establishes a program under which the Federal Government may partially reimburse "Insured Losses" (as defined in TRIA) caused by "Acts Of Terrorism" (as defined in TRIA). "Act Of Terrorism" is defined in Section 102(1) of TRIA to mean any act that is certified by the Secretary of the Treasury – in consultation with the Secretary of Homeland Security and the Attorney General of the United States – to be an act of terrorism; to be a violent act or an act that is dangerous to human life, property, or infrastructure; to have resulted in damage within the United States, or outside the United States in the case of certain air carriers or vessels or the premises of a United States Mission; and to have been committed by an individual or individuals as part of an effort to coerce the civilian population of the United States or to influence the policy or affect the conduct of the United States Government by coercion.

The Federal Government's share of compensation for such Insured Losses is 80% of the amount of such Insured Losses in excess of each Insurer's "Insurer Deductible" (as defined in TRIA), subject to the "Program Trigger" (as defined in TRIA).

In no event, however, will the Federal Government be required to pay any portion of the amount of such Insured Losses occurring in a calendar year that in the aggregate exceeds \$100 billion, nor will any Insurer be required to pay any portion of such amount provided that such Insurer has met its Insurer Deductible. Therefore, if such Insured Losses occurring in a calendar year exceed \$100 billion in the aggregate, the amount of any payments by the Federal Government and any coverage provided by this policy for losses caused by Acts Of Terrorism may be reduced.

For each coverage provided by this policy that applies to such Insured Losses, the charge for such Insured Losses is included in the premium for such coverage. The charge for such Insured Losses that has been included for each such coverage is the percentage of the premium for such coverage indicated below, and does not include any charge for the portion of such Insured Losses covered by the Federal Government under TRIA.

The City Hall administrative staff and the Police Department have experienced several positive COVID cases and isolations due to exposures in the last three (3) weeks. We believe this will continue to be a concern through the end of the year, if not longer.

There are employees who had vacation time scheduled during November and December. Some of those employees are on COVID leave and unable to use the vacation time that was scheduled. Others who are able to work have already cancelled vacation days to ensure that minimum staffing levels are maintained through the remainder of the year.

The City of Clinton Personnel Manual states that General and Police personnel are allowed to carry-over a maximum of 144 vacation hours on January 1. Any hours over 144 will be forfeited.

I am requesting that City Hall and Police Dept. staff be given until March 31, 2021, to expend vacation hours, without penalty. Any hours over 144 on April 1, 2021, will be forfeited.

After meeting with the Department Heads, we have modified the Employee Health Challenge for next year to include offsite exercise. The program has been simplified and now has 3 levels of activity options to earn Health Holiday Hours to encourage more activity. Employees will track their hours each month and turn their Activity Logs into their supervisor for approval. The supervisors will turn the sheets into the HR department to be rewarded quarterly.

The maximum amount of hours a full time employee can obtain are listed below. In 2020, the maximum amount of time to acquire was 22 hours. There is no longer gift certificates offered.

Level 1: 5.0 – 7.99 Hours of Monthly Activity1 Health Holiday Hour/Month 12 hours annually
Level 2: 8.0 – 11.99 Hours of Monthly Activity1.5 Health Holiday Hour/Month 18 hours annually
Level 3: 12+ Hours of Monthly Activity2 Health Holiday Hour/Month24 hours annually



Employee Health Challenge 2021

- All full-time and regular part-time employees are eligible to participate.
- Health Challenge time frame: **January 1, 2021 – December 31, 2021.**
- FREE admission to water aerobics classes June, July & August and morning lap swim only is free at the Artesian Pool.
- Employees must fill out monthly activity logs and turn in to their supervisor.
- Health Holiday hours are awarded based on what level you achieve and entered into the payroll system quarterly:

Clinton, Mo. – (Nov. 23, 2020) – On December 1, community partners will celebrate the completion of the Gaines Drive project with a ribbon cutting ceremony. The \$3.49 million project improves safety, enhances traffic flow and provides for future growth and development along Gaines Drive.

The City of Clinton, Golden Valley Memorial Healthcare (GVMH), Compass Health, Missouri Department of Transportation, Missouri Department of Economic Development, Missouri Transportation Finance Corporation, CJW Transportation Consultants, Capital Paving & Construction and Molly McGovern Consulting partnered on the project.
